PARKHEAD TICKET CONTROVERSY CONTINUES

In a website poll conducted by the Rangers Supporters Trust, fans voted by over 5 to 1 against the Club's recent decision to agree to taking only 7,000 tickets for the Scottish Cup quarter final tie on 7 March, when SFA rules meant the Club could have insisted on 12,000 tickets.

A spokesman stated, "This is a huge majority, especially when one bears in mind that the implications for the tie being (replayed) at Ibrox were fully explained in the way the question was worded."

He continued, "This has now become Rangers most important match of the season, and Rangers are already at a serious disadvantage playing away from home against the current League leaders. The Club should have done everything in its power to try and reduce this disadvantage, and an extra 5,000 fans there to cheer the boys on would undoubtedly have helped our cause."
